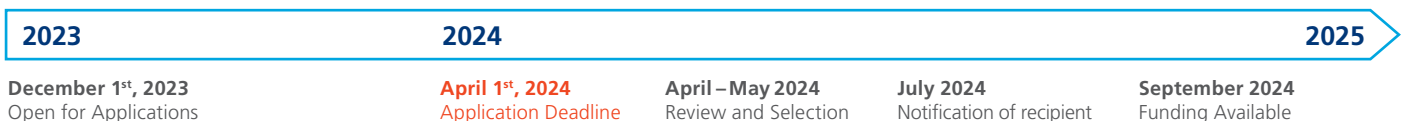
Your way to funding opportunities

Grants

Basic Research Grant & Clinical Research Grant

- 1 Please obtain approval from your institution/organisation (and co-investigators, if applicable) to apply for funding.
- 2 Download the application form from: www.access-to-insight.com
- 3 Prepare the application documents:
Complete the application form electronically, write a cover letter, provide a curriculum vitae
- 4 Send the completed application documents as email attachments to application@access-to-insight.com prior to the submission deadline (1st April).
- 5 You will receive an email within 5 working days confirming the receipt of your application.
- 6 All applications will undergo independent scientific review by the *Access to Insight* Grants Core Faculty and Review Board.
- 7 You will be notified about the decision 3 – 4 months after the application deadline.
If successful, a contractual agreement will be prepared in collaboration with your institute.
- 8 Approximately 6–8 weeks after the notification, the funding will become available.
- 9 The recipients of funding will be requested to provide a summary of their projects for the *Access to Insight* website and regular status reports to the *Access to Insight* Grants Office.
